


Transportation



Fitchburg is centrally located on Route 2, an hour's drive away from Boston, with convenient access to Interstates 190, 495 and 91. The city has easy access to major airports in Boston; Worcester; Hartford, CT; Manchester, NH and Providence, RI. Our own municipal airport offers a range of aviation services including flight training, scenic flights, charter flights and much more. The Montachusett Area Transit Authority operates a commuter rail platform in downtown Fitchburg providing passengers easy access to Boston with connections to Amtrak, as well as local bus service throughout the city and surrounding areas .

Utilities & Telecommunications

The city boasts an abundant water supply from 10 reservoirs with a 5.3 billion gallon storage capacity, acclaimed water quality and two modern wastewater treatment plants.

The city is fully served with high speed Internet through our local cable and phone companies. The availability of a central office means lower prices for specialized high speed connections in most locations.

Fitchburg's infrastructure includes access to natural gas as well as aggregated energy purchasing opportunities.

Education

With two local colleges to choose from, a newly-built, state-of-the-art high school, the Montachusett Vocational Technical Schooland a number of other public and private schools, Fitchburg's educational opportunities are plentiful. Fitchburg State College is one of the best colleges in New England for education and child development majors as well as nursing and communications. Its student teacher and business major programs are rapidly becoming popular choices for students. Internships offered through the school provide real world experience for students and opportunities to work with local businesses and government.
